Executive summary

What the recommendation means

Recommended asking price is the suggested starting Buy It Now price based on the example evidence.

Confidence reflects how closely the available evidence matches the item being reviewed.

Item 1 - Vintage Adjustable Safety Razor

Identification used	Illustrative example: 1960s-style adjustable double-edge razor with date-code details visible in client photos.
Condition supplied	Used, mechanically working, plating shows light wear; no case included.

Market evidence

In this illustrative example, closely comparable working razors show a consistent sold pattern in the upper-\$30s to mid-\$40s. Higher asks exist, but examples with cases, stronger cosmetic condition, or rarer date codes justify much of the premium. The client's example would therefore be positioned above the likely transaction range to leave room for offers.

Recommended asking price	\$49.99
Realistic expected sale range	\$38-\$46
Offer strategy	Consider offers around \$40+.
Confidence	High - The hypothetical sold examples are relatively close matches in model, condition, and completeness.

Pricing rationale

Start at \$49.99 rather than pricing directly at the expected sale range. This preserves negotiating room without putting the listing far outside the illustrated market. If the razor cleans up better than expected or a desirable date code is confirmed, the asking price could reasonably move higher.

Item 2 - Mid-Century Tabletop Globe

Condition supplied	Good display condition with light surface wear; maker label partly legible.

Market evidence

In this illustrative example, sold prices vary because globe size, maker, map era, base style, and condition materially affect demand. Comparable decorative examples cluster around the low-\$30s to low-\$40s, while identified makers and unusual map details can sell higher. Because the maker and date are not fully confirmed, a moderate-confidence range is more appropriate than a single-point estimate.

Pricing rationale

Photograph the maker label and any copyright or map date before listing. If those details identify a more collectible manufacturer or earlier map period, re-check the market before finalizing the price.

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Item 3 - Vintage Casino Dice Pair

Identification used	Illustrative example: matching translucent casino dice with casino name and serial markings visible.
Condition supplied	Used display condition; edges remain sharp; matching pair.

Market evidence

In this illustrative example, common casino dice pairs tend to sell in the low-\$20s to upper-\$20s, while closed casinos, scarcer properties, matched serial numbers, sealed examples, or documented provenance may command more. The pair appears collectible but does not show enough special evidence in the supplied example to justify a high premium.

Recommended asking price	\$29.99
Realistic expected sale range	\$22-\$28
Offer strategy	Consider offers around \$24+.
Confidence	Moderate - The range is plausible for an ordinary collectible pair, but casino scarcity and exact markings could change value.

Pricing rationale

Use clear close-ups of the casino name, serial markings, and all faces. If the property is defunct or the pair has matching serial numbers, highlight that in the title because those details can materially affect collector interest.

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
